Demographic Results - Respondents

- 67% responded (45 out of 67 programs)

Do you deliver any course(s) to students via distance education?

- 59.1% (26) Yes
- 40.9% (18) No

How long has someone in your program been offering distance education courses?

- 38.5% (10) 2 to almost 5 years
- 23.1% (6) 5 to almost 8 years
- 11.5% (3) 8 to almost 11 years
- 11.5% (3) Less than 2 years
- 7.7% (2) 11 to 13 years
- 3.8% (1) Always
- 3.8% (1) Through a grant years ago; currently about 3 years
