COURSE GOAL and OBJECTIVES

The primary goal of this course is to facilitate your transition from student to professional in a human services field, with professional responsibilities, attitudes, and behaviors.

You are expected to learn and demonstrate professional attitudes and behaviors in these areas:

- being on time for all responsibilities in your Practicum setting and in class
- completing your work in a professional manner and on time, in your Practicum setting and in class
- missing hours in your Practicum setting, *or* class meetings, *only* for illness or unavoidable schedule conflict
- communicating responsibly and professionally with clients, supervisors, and others
- identifying your strengths and areas for improvement in professional work
- accepting and acting on critical feedback from supervisors and other professionals
- writing professionally competent, grammatically correct papers and reports
- understanding ethical and human diversity issues in human services
- applying psychological concepts in practice
- making informed plans for your future

EVALUATION

In this course, you will receive a P (Pass) or F (Fail) for your final grade. However, this is **NOT** the usual pass-fail course. The Pass grade in this course requires professional-level performance, in your Practicum setting AND in the weekly Practicum assignments for class.

Your grade will be based on two factors, which are equally important:

(1) your learning and performance at your field site, evaluated by your on-site supervisor;

(2) your class attendance and participation, and your writing of papers.

Unsatisfactory performance on the supervisor evaluation OR attendance OR writing of assigned papers will result in a course grade of F.

You will receive regular feedback on your strengths *and* your areas for improvement. Your response to constructive, critical supervision, from me or from your Practicum setting supervisor, will be an important part of your grade.

EVALUATION OF PAPERS FOR CLASS

Writing professionally competent papers, on time, is an important goal of this course. Your course grade of P or F depends on your performance on these papers.

Each weekly paper is graded on a 0-3 scale: 3 = Excellent; 2 = Satisfactory; 1 = Unsatisfactory; 0 = Missing. (Students who are out of the Bloomsburg area must also submit weekly journals, which are graded on the same scale.) If your average grade on these papers, across the semester, is less than 2.0 on this scale, you will fail the course.

The most important paper is the Summary Paper, due near the end of the semester. This paper is graded this on the same 0-3 scale. *If your grade is below a 2 on this paper, you will fail the course.*

Late papers are accepted ONLY in VERY EXCEPTIONAL circumstances. This MUST be arranged with me before the paper is due.

ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION

By the end of the semester, you must complete **40 hours of work at your Practicum setting per credit hour** enrolled. You also must meet with your field supervisor or a person your supervisor designates, at least once a week. You are required to arrange a weekly work schedule with your field supervisor, and to stick to that schedule or clear any changes with your supervisor. Any absence at your field site must be made up, in order to complete your required number of hours there. You are required to attend class, unless you make arrangements with me ahead of time. Most of this class time will be spent discussing your expectations, emotions, and experiences in your Practicum and how those relate to your future plans. This is a good time to learn from your classmates' experiences as well as from my supervision. If necessary, you may be required to meet with your field supervisor and faculty supervisor in your setting. If you must miss class, you must make arrangements for this before class begins. This is a very important professional responsibility. The reasons must involve illness, an event at your Practicum that cannot be rescheduled, a death in your immediate family, religious observance, or military duty. You must submit a journal for any week that you miss class.

If your Practicum is outside the Bloomsburg region, you are required to attend the meeting on campus for the first class. After that, you are not required to attend classes on campus, but you are required to submit a weekly journal in addition to other paper requirements.

PAPER DEADLINES

See "Practicum Paper Requirements" (handout, also on Bolt) for details on preparing and submitting all papers.

See the Practicum Class Schedule for the dates of classes, which are due dates for papers (and journals if you must write them). Unless otherwise noted, you must submit required papers electronically, by 4 pm on the day of class.

If you miss any class, you must submit a journal (an attachment to an email) for the week preceding that class. Submit journals as an email attachment, from your bloomu.edu address. Submit the journal as soon as possible after your absence.

If your Practicum is outside the Bloomsburg region, you must submit a weekly journal every week. Submit journals to Dr. Leitzel as an email attachment, from your bloomu.edu address. Your weekly journal is due by 4 pm on the day of class.

PRACTICUM CLASS SCHEDULE
